

Registering for the Test

Sixth Registration or More

A candidate may sit for the PCAT examination no more than five times. After the fifth examination, a candidate may be required to submit a written request for an additional testing session. If registering for your sixth, or more, examination:

- Register online as usual.
- Have documentation ready and be able to explain the special circumstances that require you to take the PCAT again.
 - Refer to the checklist on the PCAT website to ensure you have all required documentation.
- If documentation is requested and not provided, registration will be cancelled per standard policy.
- If you test without providing the requested documentation, your scores will be cancelled.

Acceptable forms of documentation include:

- A copy of a completed and submitted application to a pharmacy school or to PharmCAS for the upcoming academic year and a transaction confirmation from the institution.
- OR**
- A letter on official school letterhead stationery from a pharmacy school advisor, administrator, or faculty member recommending that you take the PCAT as well as verifying that you are applying to a pharmacy school for the upcoming academic year.

Pearson will review and respond to your written request and evidence within 10 business days of receipt. Please note that heavy volume may delay the ability to reply within that time frame so we recommend that a candidate submit evidence well in advance of an examination. Pearson has the right to deny you the ability to test, based solely on your previous test administrations. If you are denied, you can appeal by contacting PSE customer relations with supporting documentation. Note that the retest policy will be enforced even if a violation is not immediately identified and test scores have been reported. If you take the PCAT test more often than allowed, your scores from each unauthorized test administration will be withheld or cancelled and your entire test fee will be forfeited. You may also be prohibited from future PCAT testing and may be subject to other remedial actions. This policy has been established to enhance the validity and security of the PCAT exam. PCAT Customer Service representatives and test administrators are not authorized to waive or modify the retest policy for any reason.
