1. What languages are available on Q-global®?

Both English and Spanish options are available.

2. Do I need to purchase a manual if I'm using ASRS on Q-global?

A digital manual is included with the purchase of ASRS Q-global score reports. All digital ASRS users will get access to the manual on Q-global.

3. What Q-global report options are currently available?

We currently offer a single-rater interpretive report.

4. Can you download the ASRS report as a .doc?

Yes. The report is available for download as both a .doc and .pdf.

5. Are the long forms and short forms available on Q-global?

Yes. ASRS on Q-global offers the following forms in both English and Spanish: ASRS Parent/Caregiver (2-5), ASRS Parent/Caregiver (6-18), ASRS Teacher/Childcare Provider (2-5), ASRS Teacher/Childcare Provider (6-18), ASRS Short-Form (2-18)

6. What if I want to use Q-global for scoring, but not for administration?

You have the option to print paper forms from Q-global to give to the parents or teachers.

When the form is returned to you, you can enter the scores manually into Q-global and generate the report. You can print as many forms as you need. You will not be charged for the use until it is entered, scored, and a report is generated.

7. Are there any content changes?

No, the content is the same, we have just made ASRS available on our digital platform, Q-global.

8. How can I get access to the ASRS if I am a DALs user?

ASRS is available for DALs users under the new MHS Education 2025 Portfolio. If you currently have the MHS Education portfolio (for Conners 4™) and would like ASRS added before your DALs license renews, contact your Pearson Consultant to discuss how you can get DALs access to the ASRS.
