

NEW! INTRODUCTION TO THE MMPI-3:

This intermediate-level workshop introduces the MMPI-3, which is scheduled for publication in 2020. It is assumed that attendees will have graduate level training in psychological testing and assessment. (6 CE credits)

THURSDAY, JUNE 18

NEW! ADVANCED MMPI-3 INTERPRETATION:

This advanced-level workshop is designed for individuals who have completed the "Introduction to the MMPI-3" workshop. Attendees will further develop MMPI-3 interpretation knowledge & skills by acquiring greater familiarity with the normative changes and their implications for interpretation, the MMPI-3 Validity Scales & use of the MMPI-3 in diagnostic assessments. (6 CE credits)

NEW! FORENSIC APPLICATIONS OF THE MMPI-3:

This advanced-level workshop focuses on use of the MMPI-3 in forensic psychological evaluations, and is designed for individuals who have completed the "Introduction to the MMPI-3" workshop. Topics include general considerations when using the MMPI-3 in forensic evaluations, how to respond to admissibility challenges, use of the MMPI-3 in criminal court cases, use of the MMPI-3 in personal injury evaluations & use of the MMPI-3 in police and public safety suitability and fitness for duty evaluations. During the annual symposium, papers and poster presentations report the most recent studies on the MMPI instruments in research and clinical use. *This two-day symposium offers 11 CE credit hours.*

All presenters must submit a Proposal Submission Form and an abstract by Monday, March 16, 2020.

Authors will be notified of the status of their submission by late-April. A schedule of presentations and information about the meeting will be sent at a later date. Presenters receive a reduced registration fee (\$125) that will cover attendance at all symposium sessions. Travel, housing, and other expenses are the responsibility of the presenter.
