

Workplace Personality Inventory™–II for Pharmacy Students (WPI–II) Overview

Published by NCS Pearson, the Workplace Personality Inventory was introduced in 2007 and then revised as WPI–II in 2013. Features of the WPI–II include:

- 192 questions
- 25–35 minutes to complete
- Non-academic, work-relevant content
- Relatively inexpensive
- Easy to interpret score reports
- Reliable, valid, and fair
- Resistant to faking
- Taken online at any time from any location
- Normed on 4th year pharmacy students in PharmD programs

From 2014–2016, Pearson collected WPI–II score data from students enrolled at nine pharmacy schools. These data were used to determine percentile ranks appropriate for evaluating the personal and professional characteristics of applicants to pharmacy programs or for monitoring the progress of currently enrolled students.

Following the completion of the WPI–II, the candidate receives a **Development Report** with scores and each pharmacy school the candidate indicated receives a **Profile Report**. Each report contains 6 work style domain scores and 16 work style behavior scores, based on the U.S. Department of Labor’s Occupational Information Network (O*Net):
