Participants learn its theoretical basis—phonological awareness, memory, rapid naming—and their role in reading development. Guidance is included for using scores, SEM, and classifications ethically and securely. CTOPP-2 results aid comprehensive evaluation but are not meant for independent diagnosis or instructional decisions.
